Her seemingly boundless flexibility makes her both approachable for students and amenable to colleagues.

Because her commitment to her students is palpable in both her English and Theatre classes, Cadence has earned her reputation with students and staff as a hardworking and effective educator. Her dynamic and courteous personality, coupled with her obvious expertise and continuing curiosity, has made her very popular with students and with staff.
